Richard's Reflections

Do you ever go through periods in your life when everything is a bit of a grind? When it is hard to get out of bed and face things, and life seems an endless list of things to do, and none of them seem that pleasurable?

One of the mediaeval mystics Meister Eckhart spoke of the 'via negativa' (a complicated term!), times when God often seems a million miles away.

It is interesting how there are many references in the Bible to perseverance and endurance. We don't like to dwell on this often as it can seem a bit negative, but it must be important as it is a recurring theme in the Psalms, in Jesus' teaching and the letters of Paul. Elijah was so despondent after his greatest triumph that he became suicidal. Many early Christians faced persecution, as do modern Christians in Egypt, North Korea and other parts of the world. Our problems may appear trivial compared to these, but we can allow our problems to dominate us if we let them. We also face a spiritual battle, and we need to be prepared to fight.

Life is not always like this, and we have easier times, a 'via positiva', when it is easier to feel joyful. Jesus was accused of being too much of a party animal- he knew good times and enjoyed them, and so should we. There is a time to feast, as well as fast.

It is in the via negativa, when God seems furthest away, that our faith develops most as we learn to keep going- and is not dependent on how we feel. It is easy to believe when life is going well. But if our faith endures the via negativa it will become more robust. We should recognize the importance and value of difficult times. When we look back over our lives, these times are often the most meaningful- and in a strange way the most joyful.
